PSR and Sacramental Preparation Information**PSR Information:**

Dear Parents of Students entering 1st through the 8th grade this fall. Our Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered to help you educate your child or children in their Catholic Faith. PSR meets on Monday evenings September through April. If Sports are an issue, we do offer our program as a Family Homeschool Model for grades 3-8. You may Homeschool the entire year or just during the sport activity. All Faith Education involves our All Generation Program (L.I.G.H.T.) that meets five months during the school year.

Sacramental Preparation:

First Holy Communion Preparation is separate from PSR and involves Parents. **All students must attend a year of PSR or Catholic Day School prior to First Communion year.**

Registration Forms can be found on our website, in the Office and in the Gathering Area. Forms include New or Returning PSR Students or Family Homeschooling, as well as, Emergency Medical Forms, Registration for First Holy Communion and the Yearly Calendar. If you have any questions please call Mary Takacs at 330-483-3808. **There is a \$10 Household Savings if your registration is in by July 29.**
