Major renovation to the church building was done in 1961 and an education building/social hall were built. After the parish celebrated its 125th anniversary, another major restoration was done in the church and a few years later the rectory house, which was originally built in 1894, also underwent restoration.

Around this same time, the people of St. Martin's looked to the future and agreed a larger church was needed. When completed in 2002, the office complex, parish center and new church would almost triple the capacity for services and guests for our famous Chicken and Ham dinners. On the first Sunday in November, 2002 near the feast of our patron saint, Bishop Anthony Pilla solemnly dedicated the new church. The old church is now designated as the Chapel and is used for smaller gatherings.

The present cemetery has been in use from about 1850. An expansion of the grounds took place around 1990 and includes a pond, walkways, monuments and a twenty foot axed granite cross along with a shrine to Our Lady of Fatima.

One hundred seventy – three years after the first frontier Mass was celebrated in the Lawling home, life continues to grow and prosper for the Catholic community of St. Martin of Tours.

History of St. Martin of Tours



On a June morning in 1840, a group of German Catholics from the Abbeyville area rode to Strongsville to meet Bishop Purcell of Cincinnati, and Father O'Dwyer. The next day, Father O'Dwyer offered Mass in the home of Mr. Lawling. This marked the beginning of St. Martin's parish, six years before the founding of the Diocese of Cleveland.

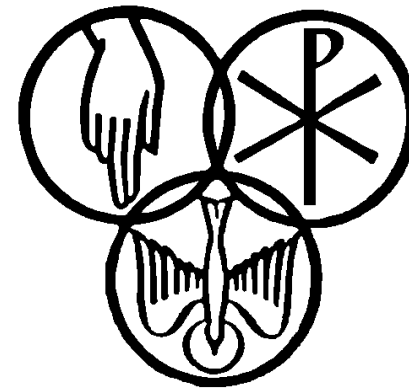
In the beginning, there were two churches - one to the east of the Rocky River and the other to the west, because of the often swollen river. By 1849, both of these churches were too small for their growing congregations. A majority selected a third site in Liverpool township near Station and Law roads (the land was obtained from Aloys Grabenstetter) and was dedicated under the patronage of St. Martin of Tours.

In 1860 the church was again found to be too small and the present Chapel was built at a cost of \$30,000. Local farmers who agreed to give a year of their time performed all the work. The brick for the building was made from clay, dug and fired within a half mile of the site. In the spring of 1861, time was taken to plow the fields, then they were left to the Lord's care. Parish tradition tells us that it was one of the best harvests in years. The interior of the building took another 20 years to complete. The altars were built by German craftsmen and statues were purchased from Germany. In 1881 the large pipe organ built by the Milwaukee firm of Odenbrett & Abler was brought to the church. This historic organ is housed in a carved butternut Gothic case with a polished tin façade and is still in use today. In 1897 the stained glass windows were installed.

In the early 1940's a parish centennial was held in a period that marked many changes in the small rural community. Sometime in the previous 10 years, the school that had existed closed. Masses ceased to be held in the German language and the horse barn to the north of the church was dismantled, as the family automobile replaced the horse and buggy.

The Single/Separated/Divorced Ministries

These are active programs and retreats where healing and reconciliation are possible. The pain of being single or separated or divorced is one of the most intense feelings a human being can face. True healing of this kind of pain can only come from God's presence in the life of a person experiencing it. Many of our programs feature video instruction and group discussion and sharing. Single & Parenting, DivorceCare and The Smart Step Family are provided to help.

Single & Parenting

Single parents come into the position of parenting alone a number of ways: divorce, separation, death, adoption, legal guardianship or a father or mother who chooses to raise a child on his or her own. People who have been a single parent have an intimate understanding of the needs of other single parents; they will have a special sensitivity as they interact with group members. Single & Parenting is designed to be part seminar/part group discussion.

The Smart Step Family

Series presents facts concerning remarriages and that couples need to hear significant key principles of successful stepfamily living. Many key principles differ greatly from what they already believe about family life. Statistics show how 1/3 of all weddings will give birth to a step-family. 2/3 of those couples will get divorced and 1/3 are getting divorced again. This course will help with parents who remarry with kids. Participating in this workshop will work to prevent re-divorce for the step-family. The Step Family has programs to encourage the blended family and help with future marriages the second time. Children are welcome to participate with certain programs. Programs are available on an as need basis by anyone.

DivorceCare

This program is designed as an ongoing ministry to separated and divorced people. The program takes a biblical approach to divorce, separation and related issues such as reconciliation, remarriage, forgiveness and the effect of divorce on children and families. A video series, filled with practical tips on dealing with Anger, Depression, Loneliness, Financial Survival, Reconciliation and Forgiveness. Surviving the Holidays is a yearly program to help during Thanksgiving and Christmas time.

Children's Liturgy of the Word - Fulfills Mass Obligation

Adults, adolescents and teens are needed to lead and help with this youthful Liturgy celebration. Children 4 years - 2nd grade are invited to celebrate the Introductory Rite and Liturgy of the Word in their own worship space, (Chapel) and at their own level. Children's Liturgy takes place during the 10:30 Mass October – April except holiday weekends. Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are commissioned to assist the priest in the distribution of the Eucharist at Mass, to the homebound and at the nursing home. Must be a fully initiated Catholic, have a love of Christ and the Eucharist, and a desire to serve the parish at Mass. The time required serving is at Mass on a rotating schedule (generally every 3 weeks), nursing home - rotating schedule (generally once a month) and homebound visits are made weekly. Nursing Home visits are every Thursday at 10:00 a.m. and homebound visits are every Wednesday. Ministers are commissioned by the Diocese for 5 year periods. Diocesan Certification is offered in the spring and fall. Further training is provided at St. Martin's as needed.

Ham Dinner in November - all youth are asked to help serve the dinners, clean up and set up.

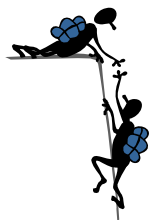
Chicken Dinner in July - youth are asked to serve the second shift in the dining room.

RCIA

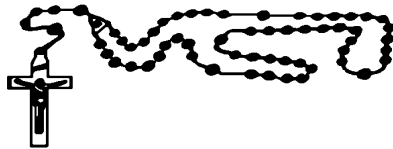

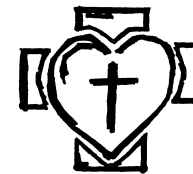
